THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Isanti County Board of Commissioners that pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 469.1082 Subdivision 8 and 469.093 Subdivision 2 that the Enabling Resolution for the creation of an Economic Development Authority in the County of Isanti; State of Minnesota be amended as follows: SECTION 3 EDA Board appointments and terms of office (voting members) 3.01 The EDA governing body shall be a Board consisting of nine voting members. SECTION 4 EDA Board Appointment and term of office (Non Voting Members). 4.01 the Chair of the EDA governing body shall serve as a non voting member of the governing board. 4.02 the Chair of the EDA governing body shall be a resident of or own or manage a commercial or industrial enterprise at least partially located within Isanti County. 4.03 the Chair of the EDA governing Isanti County shall be elected for a one year term.
