oOo Chairperson Southerland convened the meeting and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

11/04-27 Motion by Duff, seconded by Morris to approve the agenda with an addition of A-11, discussion of EMS Council. Motion carried.

11/04-28 Motion by Larson, seconded by Morris to approve the minutes of the April 6th, 2011 County Board Meeting. Motion carried.

11/04-29 Motion by Morris, seconded by Larson to approve the following 2011-2012 Collective Bargaining Agreements: Teamsters Local 320-Courthouse and Teamsters Local 320 Family Services. Motion carried.

11/04-30 Motion by Larson, seconded by Morris to approve the 2011-2012 Collective Bargaining Agreement with LELS Local 209 Jailers/Dispatchers. Motion carried.

11/04-34 Motion by Larson, seconded by Morris to approve the following RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CLOSURE OF COUNTY OFFICES IN ISANTI COUNTY. WHEREAS, the County faced with many difficult choices as it considered its 2011 budget; and WHEREAS, the Isanti County Board of Commissioners, acting in it's fiduciary role to manage County finances, has considered many options to balance the County's budget; and WHEREAS, these options include the prudent use of reserves and cuts to Departmental operating budgets; and WHEREAS, the Isanti County Board of Commissioners believes a portion of the budget solution must come from employee compensation and benefits; and WHEREAS, the County Board wishes to preserve as many County jobs as possible; and WHEREAS, furloughs, or unpaid days off, have been negotiated and designated in collective bargaining unit agreements; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, pursuant to M.S. Statute 373.052, Subd 1, the Isanti County Board of Commissioners resolves to close County offices May 27th, 2011, July 1st, 2011, and September 2nd, 2011. Other than the Isanti County Law Enforcement Center and Heartland Express, County offices will not be open for public business on these dates. These dates have been established pursuant to contracts with certified employee bargaining units. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Isanti County Board of Commissioners is appreciative of County employees agreeing to be part of the 2011 budget solution which could total \$135,000. Motion carried.

o0o Kevin VanHooser, County Administrator indicated that the Courthouse closing excludes law enforcement, Chisago-Isanti Heartland, Probation, and MN Extension.

o0o Craig Rempp, Transit Director, provided quotes to replace garage doors in the Transit building (on file), recommending Hasser Door's for a total of \$6576.

11/04-35 Motion by Morris, seconded by Duff to authorize the garage doors to be replaced in the Transit building by Hasser Door's in the amount of \$6576; further that said monies to come from building remodeling fund. Motion carried.

11/04-36 Motion by Larson, seconded by Duff to accept the resignation of Blaine Martinsen, PT Jailer, effective 4-14-11. Motion carried.

11/04-37 Motion by Larson, seconded by Morris to approve the Sentence to Serve Contract for FY 7-1-11 to 6-30-13 in the amount of \$115,668. Motion carried.

11/04-38 Motion by Morris, seconded by Larson to approve the following SEAT BELT AWARENESS DAY PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS, every year, many lives are lost on our roadways that could have been prevented by the single action of buckling a safety belt, and WHEREAS, safety belts reduce the risk of death and serious injury by 40% - 60% and; WHEREAS, in our communities along, several lives could have been saved within the past three years if they had worn their seatbelts, and WHEREAS, when crash victims are unbuckled, their medical treatment costs are on average 50% higher than those who are securely buckled, and WHEREAS, a seat-belted driver has a better change of maintaining control of the vehicle during and immediately following a collision, protecting passengers and others on the road, WHEREAS, seat belts aren't just for the front seat because if passengers are in the back seat and not belted, their body becomes a lethal weapon, moving forward with enough force to break the back of someone riding in the front or to cause serious brain injury, and WHEREAS, effective June 9th, 2009, new provision require everybody of all ages in every seating position in the vehicle to be buckled up or riding in an approved child passenger safety restraint so law enforcement officers can stop and cit drivers and passengers who are not buckled up. This primary enforcement provision gives the seat belt use law the same status as every other Minnesota traffic safety law, and THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the County of Isanti will continue their commitment to enforce the seat belt law through their "Click it or Ticket" efforts and declare May 6th, 2011 as: SEAT BELT AWARENESS DAY. Motion carried.

o0o Dr. Quinn Stroble, Midwest Medical Examiners, presented the 2010 Isanti County Medical Examiners Report.
