

**REGULAR MEETING OF THE ISANTI COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS**

o0o Chairperson Southerland convened the meeting and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

11/10-30 Motion by Duff, seconded by Morris to approve the agenda with the addition of A12, authorizing up to \$1000 for inserts for TNT Statements. Motion carried unanimously.

11/10-31 Motion by Larson, seconded by Duff to approve the minutes of the October 5<sup>th</sup>, 2011 County Board Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

11/10-32 Motion by Duff, seconded by Larson to approve extending the following amendments for 2012 to the Isanti County Personnel Policy Section 10.4 Voluntary Leave of Absence Without Pay: delete c.3a.) A voluntary leave of absence shall be granted only if an employee has exhausted all vacation leave; c.3b.) Pursuant to Isanti County Policy 6.6a probationary employees are not required to exhaust all vacation leave to be eligible; adding c. 3.)e.) Employees who utilize this policy and have payroll deductions, are responsible for deductions not covered by income loss. f.) Employees may choose to purchase the PERA service credit amounts as to not lose these contributions; further that said amendments will be effective 7-21-09. Motion carried unanimously.

11/10-33 Motion by Duff, seconded by Larson to approve the 2012 Medica Senior Care Secure insurance rate at \$255 per month for retiree insurance. Motion carried unanimously.

11/10-34 Motion by Larson, seconded by Warring to authorize the Administrator's Office to seek proposals for custodial services for County Office Buildings. Motion carried unanimously.

11/10-35 Motion by Duff, seconded by Warring to approve letter to MN Department of Transportation commenting on their Draft 50 Year Vision, noticing concerns with high commute times. Motion carried unanimously.

11/10-36 Motion by Larson, seconded by Morris to award the 2011-2012 snowplow bids to Landworks, Construction as low total bidder (bids on file). Motion carried unanimously.

11/10-37 Motion by Morris, seconded by Duff to approve payment to East Central Sanitation in the amount of \$4200 for materials marketed and recycled; said monies to come from SCORE. Motion carried unanimously.

11/10-38 Motion by Morris, seconded by Larson to approve the following Planning Commission Actions: 1. The request of Ronnie Anderson to present a preliminary plat of Anderson Estate (legal desc: Pt of the NW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Sec 6, Twp 34, Rg 24, Stanford Twp) with the condition that the south property line for Lot 1 Block 1 be moved further south in order for the pole building on this proposed lot to meet the 40' setback requirement from the rear property line prior to the October 19<sup>th</sup>, 2011 County Board Meeting; 2. The request of Lucas M.E. Niemi/Bucks Toys & Tire Center, for a conditional use permit for sail boat and trailer sales, jet skis, snowmobiles, 4 wheel ATV's etc., used recreational vehicles, pick ups, trucks, cars (retail tire center car & semi-tires) (legal desc: Pt of the SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Sec 32, Twp 35, Rg 23, Isanti Twp) with

the following conditions: 1. Must not put any additional run off into the right of way of State Aid Highway 65, 2. Must have adequate parking, 3. Must maintain the water run off on their own property including any additional added runoff, 4. This conditional use permit will replace the conditional use permit for Benny Marine, 5. The hours of operation will be Monday through Friday 9:00 a.m. - 9: p.m. and 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. on Saturday for sales and for the tire service will be 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday, 6. May employ up to ten employees, 7. Parking spaces as required by the Isanti County Zoning Ordinance, 8. Must have a minimum of four inches of class 5 or better for the driveway (277<sup>th</sup> Lane) and must be 24' wide to the end of the parking area, parking area must be a minimum of 4" of class 5 or better, 9. Signage to comply with the Isanti County Zoning Ordinance, 10. Security, lighting and fencing to be installed and maintained, 11. Must comply with all state and local regulations and permits, 12. No outside storage of parts and/or inoperable junk vehicles or equipment or tires, 13. The only service activity to be allowed is tire repair and mounting, 14. Outside inventory approved per the submitted site plan within the fenced in area to the west and north of the building, 15. Reviewal of this conditional use permit every two years, 16. All vehicles and equipment for sale must be operable and in good working condition, 17. All of the outside area must be moved and kept weed free, **BASED ON THE FOLLOWING FINDINGS:** 1. That the conditional use permit will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purpose already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the immediate vicinity; this area is already zoned commercial and the use is not being changed from what it was previously used for, 2. That the establishment of the conditional use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for uses predominant in the area; this is zoned for this type of activity, 3. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other facilities have been or are being provided; there is a topography map and runoff will be controlled and the roads will be upgraded and the applicant will not be seriously altering what is there, 4. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the proposed use; there is adequate parking areas, 5. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to prevent or control offensive odors, fumes, dust, noise and vibration so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, and to control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighboring properties will result; there are lights on the property currently and noise generated should not be any greater than the noise from current neighboring businesses; 3. The request of JPM2 LLC, Don Fiedler Co for an interim use permit for the mining of dirt for a wildlife pond (legal desc: E 1/2 of the NE1/4 of Sec 2, Twp 37, Rg 24, Maple Ridge Twp) with the following conditions: 1. The spoils will be kept on site and placed on upland areas, 2. The depth of the pond will be 4' with 4:1 slopes, 3. Equipment used will be scrapers and backhoes, 4. The hours of operation will be 7:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, 5. This project must be complete by September 2012, **BASED ON THE FOLLOWING FINDINGS:** 1. That the conditional use permit will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purpose already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the immediate vicinity; this is an agriculture area and this is for wildlife which complies with the Isanti County Comprehensive Plan and there is a timeline to get this project complete, 2. That the establishment of the conditional use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for uses predominant in the area; everything will be done on site, there will be no spoils removed from the property and farming is predominant in the area, 3. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or will be taken to prevent or control offensive odors, fumes, dust, noise, and vibration so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, and to control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighboring properties will result; the spoils will not be leaving the property and the area is farmland and there will be no lights for this project. Motion carried unanimously.

o0o At this time a Public Hearing was held to consider revocation of a conditional use permit. Kevin VanHooser, County Administrator read the following published Public Notice into the record: **PUBLIC NOTICE OF INTENT TO REVOKE A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Isanti County Board of Commissioners will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, October 19<sup>th</sup>, 2011 at 9:30 a.m. in the County Board Room of the Isanti County Government Center, 555 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue SW,

Cambridge, MN 55008. The purpose of the public hearing will be to consider revoking conditional use permits that were issued to Marlin Mell and Leroy Mell, 1418 W 430<sup>th</sup>, Harris, MN 55032, for the mining of peat. The conditional use permits were issued on May 19<sup>th</sup>, 2009, and May 18<sup>th</sup>, 2011, on the legal property described as the W ½ of the NW ¼ fct. of Section 2, Township 35, Range 22, North Branch Township. Comments may be made at the public hearing or may be sent in writing to: Kevin VanHooser, Isanti County Administrator, 555 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue SW, Cambridge, MN 55008 or [kevin.vanhooser@co.isanti.mn.us](mailto:kevin.vanhooser@co.isanti.mn.us) prior to the public hearing. By order of the Isanti County Board of Commissioners this 21<sup>st</sup> day of September, 2011. There were no written comments received. There were several audience members in attendance. Tim Anderson, Zoning Administrator indicated to the Board that there is now action out at the site and things are improving with the drainage issue being addressed; the piles have been knocked down and spread out. Anderson further indicated that the seeding will be done by Isanti County Soil and Water and that the elevations and dam will be taken care with final review by NRCS. Tom Wedes, Chief Deputy County Attorney indicated that June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2009 was the original date of the conditional use permit for the mining of peat, which was to be completed by 2009, which was not done. Wedes further noted that this was again on the Planning Commission Agenda in June of 2011 and was supposed to be done, however the Planning Commission recommended and the County Board approved allowing for one more month to review the conditional use permit until 9-8-11. Wedes proposed to table for 2 months, or the other option is to revoke the CUP which could take up to 6 months in civil court; or the other option is to stay a revocation for 2 months and make findings.

11/10-39 Motion by Larson, seconded by Duff to table the revocation of the Conditional Use Permit issued to Marlin Mell and Leroy Mell on 5-1-2009. Motion withdrawn by Larson.

o0o The Board proceeded with the Public Hearing to give audience members a chance to comment. Tim Anderson, Zoning Administrator indicated that Marlin Mell and LeRoy Mell applied for and received a Conditional Use Permit for the mining of peat to create a wildlife pond dated 5-1-2009; further it was reviewed in 2011 with a number of conditions not completed, or some have recently been worked on or completed. Anderson further indicated that this went to the Planning Commission on July 14<sup>th</sup>, as they were not in compliance, and the Planning Commission tabled for 2 months, noting some things have been completed recently, however final grading and the \$20,000 bond has never been secured.

11/10-40 Motion by Warring, seconded by Larson to recess the Public Hearing regarding the proposed revocation of a conditional use permit. (9:59 a.m.). Motion carried unanimously.

o0o At this time a Public Hearing was held for the purpose of park land development. Kevin VanHooser read the following published Public Notice into the record: NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ISANTI COUNTY PARK DEVELOPMENT GRANT. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN the Isanti County Parks Department will hold a public hearing for the purpose of park land development on Wednesday, October 19<sup>th</sup>, 2011 at 10:00 a.m. at the Isanti County Government Center Boardroom, 555 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue SW, Cambridge, MN 55008. Isanti County intends to extend the paved trail, construct a shelter, and add a disc golf course to further develop Springvale County Park located in the E ½, Section 20, T36N, R24W, Springvale Township. The proposal to develop this property will be presented at the hearing as required by the grant application to the State of Minnesota. The public is invited to attend and provide input on this proposed Park Legacy Grant Program Application. By Order of the Isanti County Board of Commissioners this 21<sup>st</sup> day of September, 2011. There were no written comments received. Barry Wendorf, Parks Director presented his proposal to develop this property. There were no audience members or public comment.

11/10-41 Motion by Larson, seconded by Morris to close the Public Hearing at 10:15 a.m.. Motion carried unanimously.

11/10-42 Motion by Warring, seconded by Morris to reconvene the Public Hearing regarding to consider revoking a conditional use permit issued to Marlin Mell and LeRoy Mell. Motion carried unanimously.

o0o There were various members of the audience that made comments for and against the revocation.

11/10-43 Motion by Morris, seconded by Duff to close the public hearing (10:25 a.m.). Motion carried unanimously.

11/10-44 Motion by Morris, seconded by Warring to revoke the Conditional Use Permit issued to Marlin Mell and LeRoy Mell for the mining of peat, which was issued on May 1 2009; further that said revocation is stayed for a period of 60 days contingent on the following conditions: complete removal of berm, soil to be placed on high land, grading and seeding to be complete and the filing of a \$20,000 bond. Motion carried unanimously.

11/10-45 Motion by Warring, seconded by Duff to include the following Findings in the revocation of the Conditional Use Permit issued to Marlin Mell and Leroy Mell for the mining of peat as follows: 1. substantial non-compliance has not been met in 2009 and 2011 CUP; 2. did not comply with deadlines as set in the 2009 & 2011 CUP; 3. did not follow seeding and restoration plan; 4. Did not come back until 2011 for additional reviewal as outlined in 2009; 5. Spoils were not placed on highland; further in 2011: 1. Dike not removed by July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011; 2. Final grading was not done by September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2011; 3. Did not post a Bond in the amount of \$20,000 by June 15; 4. Final grading was not getting done in August 2011; and 5. The non-compliance was not due to weather. Motion carried unanimously.

11/10-46 Motion by Morris, seconded by Larson to set a Public Hearing on Wednesday, November 16<sup>th</sup>, 2011 at 9:30 a.m. for the updated Isanti County Local Water Management Plan. Motion carried unanimously.

11/10-47 Motion by Larson, seconded by Warring to approve the following ISANTI COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 11-13-05 REVOCATION OF ISANTI COUNTY ROAD 54. WHEREAS, the Isanti County Board of Commissioners, State of Minnesota, has determined that a segment of County Road (CR) 54, located within the Corporate Limits of the City of Braham, be revoked as a County Road under the Provisions of Minnesota Law, and WHEREAS, upon the revocation of said segment of County Road 54 by the County, the City of Braham shall assume jurisdiction of and place said roadway segment on the Municipal Street system, and NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that County Road 54 beginning at a point 2636 feet east of the northwest corner of Section 2, T37N, R23W, (a.k.a. the junction of CSAH 4 and CR 54), then southeasterly for a distance of 0.40 miles to the junction of Trunk Highway 107 and County Road 54, and thereby terminating, is hereby revoked as a County Road. Motion carried unanimously.
